MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



From safari....

Walk through any garden center and you will see a variety of firepits for patios/backyards. We are both mesmerized and frightened by fire. With family, friends, and neighbors we sit

around firepits. We recline in front of fireplaces. Lack a fireplace, check out YouTube or your cable channels. At the same time we invest in smoke alarms and fire extinguishers.

Fires are destructive. Homes are destroyed. Lives are lost. Long standing forests are left charred. In the case of nature, fire can be beneficial. The fire allows new growth to take place and, in some cases, it is only fire that will bring these plants to life.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the disciples, he has come to set the earth on fire. Fire is purification, an act of judgment. Jesus has come to cast out the evil in the world and to draw people to following the will of God. In the Acts of the Apostles, tongues of fire descend upon the disciples. Set on fire, the disciples overcome their fears and preach the good news.

For Luke, a follower of Jesus is to be both on fire with God's love and setting fires. At our baptism, the fire of God's love was poured upon us. As disciples we are to be united to God's will. We are to be God's instruments in the world which burn away evil and bring about new life.

With our hand on the bible, we also need to have a finger on the pulse of the world. The message of the Gospel will bring division because it challenges the values of this world. The gospel says --- service rather than weapons; love rather than hatred; welcome rather than exclusion; forgiveness rather than revenge; peace rather than conflict.

The writer of Hebrews tells us to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus Christ. Jesus shows us the way. He had his struggles with the religious people and others. Midst his struggles he was consistent in bringing the message of God's love. He accepted his father's will in life even though it meant dying on a cross.

Our weekly gathering as community helps keep our flame of faith burning, to follow Jesus boldly. Enabling us to follow Jesus' lead. And every time we gather, we are surrounded by that great cloud of witness.


Included among those saintly witnesses are our departed loved ones, friends, and mentors, all encouraging us to remain faithful in trial.



PARKING LOT REPAIR

Our parking lots will be receiving some much needed care. The south lot will have a portion of it tore out and repaved. The balance of that lot will be seal-coated and re-striped. The north lot will be crack-filled, seal-coated and re-striped. That means there will be some adjustments for parking in the next couple of weeks.

The south lot will be closed next Tuesday, August 16 for prep work and Wednesday, August 17 for repaving. The north lot will be crack-filled and seal-coated on Thursday, August 18th and Friday, August 19th. When this work is taking place staff, parishioners, and visitors will have to alternate which side of the parking lot to use. Please adjust your parking habits accordingly. Pray for good weather, safety for the workers, and patience and understanding for all who are coming and going over this time. Our community is experiencing all kinds of traffic challenges. For a short time there will be parking challenges at St. Francis as well. Hang in there — we'll get through this!

As we learn more about the balance of the seal-coating and re-striping timeline, that information will be shared. This is a \$50,000 expense that couldn't put off any longer. Any extra gifts to help paying for this will be appreciated. Good stewards from our parish come through when help is needed. Our parish is very blessed!
