With firearm deer hunting season right around the corner, many are preparing by sighting in their



firearms, organizing equipment,

preparing deer stands and sharing deer hunting stories.

The reasons for deer hunting vary with each hunter. For many hunters I have encountered, including myself, the joy of being surrounded by God's creation, goodness and peace have been expressed as a key reason.

When you immerse yourself in God's wonderful creation while hiking, camping, fishing, canoeing or deer hunting, there is a tremendous opportunity to open yourself to encountering God through God's fingerprints left all around us.

"Let the heavens be glad and the earth rejoice; let the sea and what fills it resound; let the plains be joyful and all this is in them. Then let all the trees of the forest rejoice before the Lord". Psalm 96:11-12

Hunting and just being outdoors creates space to grow in gratitude for God's goodness, love and the care God has for each one of us. This time allows space for a deeper appreciation of our interconnectedness with God's creation, and therefore the welfare of humanity that is woven into care for creation.

Pope Francis reminds us in his Apostolic Exhortation, Laudato Si: On Care for our Common Home, "Our relationship with the environment can never be isolated from our relationship with others and with God." n119

Care for God's Creation is also a central theme of Catholic Social Teaching that when we protect our environment, we are taking a pro-life position, especially toward those who are most effected by climate change.

My prayer for all of us this hunting season is to be safe, have fun, enjoy stories of the deer that got away and strengthen relationships, especially with our creator as we are gifted with time to reflect in gratitude for the gifts that God has bestowed on us. A grateful heart leads to a joyful and peaceful mind in Christ.

VETERANS DAY

Are you Prepared?



There are many things that we prepare for in life; the birth of a baby, starting college or a new job, a marriage, a move to another place. We also prepare daily in the making of meals, preparing for school or work, or maybe a vacation. Certainly, we understand that preparing calls for action on our part.

So it is with us as we prepare to meet the Lord. As our Church nears the end of a liturgical year with the Feast of Christ the King on November 22nd, we begin to hear in the Gospel the need to prepare ourselves for the coming of Jesus Christ. In parables we learn how important it is to remain vigilant and committed that we might be prepared to meet Jesus when he comes, for we know not the hour.

I understand theologically that as a Church we are preparing for the Second Coming of Christ, the Parousia, but I most often think of meeting the Lord at the moment of death, something we will all experience. Thinking about it prompts a

number of questions; Will I be prepared? Am I living my life in such a way that I will be proud to meet the Lord? Will the Lord know me as a committed follower, or will he not recognize me? Will he know my heart and my voice, familiar to him through my prayers?

We might do well to think about this, our relationship to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Is God a part of my daily life? Do I pray in thoughts and words often? Do I understand and appreciate that all I have is from God - life, love, happiness? Do I trust God enough to turn to him for all my needs? Am I actively living as a Christian who understands my role in caring for and loving all people?

Take time in the coming weeks to think about how you might focus on being prepared to meet the Lord. Like the ten virgins in today's Gospel: Will you be one of the five who were prepared when

the bridegroom came, or one of those who were not allowed to enter because of a lack of planning. It is time to actively prepare.
