Easter Greetings!

All of our faith hinges on the fact Jesus Christ, the God-man, rose from the dead. This is crazy!

When we think of oxymoron, irony and paradox, we often don't

understand at face value what is going on. Most of us enjoy the use of oxymorons: Definitely-maybe, farewell-reception, original-copy, deafening-silence, tight-slacks, jumbo-shrimp, alone-together and the list goes on. Insights into the context of these things of course gives us a greater understanding, but there does remain something a little mysterious about them.

When it comes to the paradoxes of our faith, this takes on a new level. The mysteriousness of our faith takes on a more concrete form when we say yes to that paradox, the God-man. One of my favorite passages speaking about the mystery of God is from St. Augustine, where he states,

"What then are you my God? most piteous and most just; most hidden and most near; most beautiful and most strong, stable, yet contained by none; unchangeable, yet changing all things; never new, never old; making all things new, yet bringing old age upon the proud without their knowing it (Job 9:5); always working, yet ever at rest; gathering, yet needing nothing; sustaining, pervading, and protecting; creating, nourishing, and developing; seeking, and yet possessing all things. You love, yet do not burn; are jealous, yet free from care; You repent, yet do not suffer; are angry, yet serene; You change Your ways, leaving Your plans unchanged; You recover what You find, without ever having lost it." (Confessions, Book 1, Chapter 4)

Today in our sequence we contemplate the tomb of Christ, who is living. This does not make sense to us at face value. Only when we enter into the mystery and begin to contemplate the wounded-healer, who gives life through death, do we realize that we really need to die to self if we desire to receive his life within us. May God bless you all!!

Updates for One in Christ ACC Planning Council virtual meeting held March 2, 2021.

Committees:

- Stewardship Committee reviewed its efforts to educate parishioners on stewardship and discussed ways to coordinate with the Evangelization Committee on common goals. They looked at what other dioceses are doing and ways to make their message clear and consistent in all of the member parishes.
- Evangelization Committee Follow-up phone calls to those who received letters from the ACC Council are being made to connect with parish households, ask for any prayer requests and questions they may have, and welcome them to share their faith journey in our ACC. Work is being done to promote a better understanding of Evangelization.
- Young Adult Committee Sacred Heart continues to offer events that are open to all parishes. The Council discussed the need for a more detailed job description for a Young Adult coordinator and the amount and method of compensation. The committee will finalize this proposal and share it with the Finance and Pastoral Councils in each parish for their consideration and questions. Any decision regarding hiring will be considered in the future with the consent of the four parishes and their pastors.
- Worship Committee will meet to discuss adding more members to the committee and discussing the role of this committee going forward.

The Council reviewed the joint bulletin and discussed parishioners' feedback and the content for the individual parishes. Ways to make the best use of space in the bulletin are being explored.

Livestream Issues

We began to livestream Sunday Mass nearly a year ago with Bitstream TV and for the first nine months, it worked flawlessly. Now in the last couple of months, we have had spotty internet issues and have been working diligently to identify the problem. To be clear, Bitstream TV and their equipment is not responsible for the issues we have experienced. Rather, the issue has been the stability of St. Francis Xavier's internet network at the time of broadcast. It has been extremely frustrating as we have been unable to fully identify the root cause. We have a plan in place to test Spectrum's internet speeds to our network an hour before Palm Sunday's 10:30 livestreamed Mass to help identify and correct any issues before we go live. We apologize for the recent problems we have had with our broadcast and we thank you for your patience as we work through these issues.

We continue to make steps forward to normalcy. It was a year ago that COVID restrictions started. Just a reminder we need to continue wearing masks and practicing physical distancing at Mass. Recently I received a call from a parishioner who decided to attend Mass in person and was disturbed that not everyone was wearing a mask. Offer support. Everyone is different, and may want very specific help or no help at all. Either way, ask and be open to the answer.
