MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



"In the name of the Father, + and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Each time we make the Sign of the Cross, we are using the earliest known Christian creed. This first brief "Profession of Faith" is the proclamation of the Trinity: that when we say "God" we mean a Communion of three co-equal, co-eternal Persons. There

is only one God; but God is not alone.

Like many others, St. Augustine tried to probe the depths of this unfathomable mystery, the inner life of the infinite God. He found "traces of the Trinity," as he put it, in things like fire: flame, warmth, light can be distinguished, but are inseparable from one and the same fire; or a flower, with color, scent, and life; or best, the human person with our mind's ability to remember, to understand, and to will.

All that gets complicated for our limited human understanding. But because we are made in the image of this God, three and one, love is our true key to the Trinity, for God is Love (I John 4:8). We are most like God, and most fully ourselves, when we give and receive love. This human love is a reflection of God's: as St. Paul says, true love is patient; kind; not jealous or pompous or inflated or rude or self-seeking. It is love that is forgiving and enduring and filled with hope; love that never fails (I Corinthians 13:4-8).

So as we ponder the Trinity this weekend, perhaps couples might look again at their wedding rings; parents and children spend a few minutes with their baptismal pictures; those who have a religious vocation remember that day when Christ claimed us for His service; single persons reflect on their own baptismal calling as signs of Christ's freedom in the world. For each of us, in our own vocation, is called to mirror the love of Father, Son, and Spirit to the world.

Another essential lesson from the Trinity is unity: though the Persons are distinct, they are one and the same God. As we consider all that divides us — war, political viewpoints, convictions of faith, social differences, even our favorite sports teams and pastimes — we remember that unity is a gift but also an ongoing task. Unity does not erase our individuality, but it brings it into a harmony, a oneness that enhances rather than reduces the uniqueness of each.

What simple gesture can you make today to further peace with the people who share life with you? It might be an overdue apology; or letting go of a resentment; or a sincere prayer for someone who irks you; or a cutting remark that you dismiss from your

mind and do not utter. It might be a donation, or returning a borrowed item; or just a friendly smile to a passerby.

Make the Sign of the Cross deliberately today. May it remind us whose we are, and how great is our dignity, made in the image of God Who is strong, loving, and wise (see II Timothy 1:7).

Monday, May 27 is a national holiday, and for many, the "beginning of summer." Lots of people will be on the roads for a long weekend, enjoying our freedom. But as always, it is essential that we also take some moments that day in particular to remember those who served, lived, and died in the Armed Forces to preserve that freedom across many generations, through many conflicts. As we think of our own loved ones who are deployed around the world, we recognize the great sacrifices that liberty requires. Let us remember with sincere gratitude those who left behind family, career, comfort ... and even life itself ... in the effort to defend justice in a troubled world. May their souls, and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God rest in peace.


St. Cloud DCCW "Lord of the Dance" is the theme for Fun, Food & Fund Day June 20, 2024

CEMETERIES-MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial Day Flower / Decoration Rules for Assumption, Calvary, and Sacred Heart Cemeteries

Memorial Day will be observed on Monday, May 27, 2024. With gratitude and respect for those who have served in our nation's military to preserve peace and freedom, Memorial Day is a time to honor our deceased veterans.

One common and beautiful way to do so is with flowers on the burial places of those we remember. Cemeteries are glad to accommodate this act of remembrance and hope. To assure good order for all, cemeteries have rules for what is permitted and appropriate. Below you will find the rules for the three diocesan cemeteries of Assumption and Calvary in St. Cloud and Sacred Heart in Sauk Rapids. (For other cemeteries, whether parish-based or civil, please contact the management of each cemetery through the parish or the county where it is located.)

Memorial Day Rules:

Vases can be turned over for use on the Saturday before Memorial Day (that is, on May 25).

Additional flowers may be placed on graves two days prior to Memorial Day (on Saturday) but must be removed within three days after Memorial Day (by Thursday, May 30). All remaining flowers will be disposed of by the Cemetery.

Small United States flags welcomed two days before and through Memorial Day and must be reclaimed by those placing them.

As you may recall, each of our One in Christ ACC parishes retains its own Pastoral Council, with at least one member of each parish council also serving on the joint ACC Pastoral Council. The ACC Council discerns common goals for the whole ACC, and the individual Pastoral Councils determine how to implement those common goals in their own parish communities and collaborate with the other parishes, along with attending to their own specific parish needs and programs.

As many parishes do, we will follow a discernment process modeled on that described in the Acts of the Apostles. On the weekends of June 1-2 and June 8-9, slips of paper and pencils will be in the pews for parishioners to nominate any confirmed member of Annunciation for consideration to serve on it's Pastoral Council. You may certainly nominate yourself, or anyone else you believe would have the vision, interest, and broad parish and Area Catholic Community perspectives to serve in this way.

Those nominated will be contacted to determine if they are willing to serve a three-year term on the Council, which meets quarterly. Those willing to serve will be invited to a discernment evening on June 19, when the work of the Council is more fully described and any questions can be addressed. The names of the potential Council members are placed in a basket and drawn at random at that gathering in the context of prayer to the Holy Spirit. Those whose names are drawn will begin their service on the Council on July 1.
