#### MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



How do we know what is the right thing to do? How can we think through complex choices where the answer is not obvious, where each option has some pros and some cons, some expected goods and some anticipated weaknesses?

This is the area of discernment. To discern well, we need a goal we are trying to achieve, and a set of rules or principles to follow as a guide or template to assure we don't miss important elements. Bear with me in what will be a little abstract.

Our goals can vary and often overlap, so a self-honest assessment is necessary. We can make noble-sounding claims, but what really motivates me? Is it charity, concern for the good of others, health, spiritual growth? Or might it be comfort, personal advantage, envy, selfishness, my own preferences and opinions regardless of their impact on others?

From the perspective of faith, as St. Ignatius of Loyola taught, what we are seeking to discover is the will of God.

Sometimes, when it is a choice between evident right and wrong, God's will is clear. But more often, as persons given the gift of freedom, we have to weigh a range of considerations.

The topic of discernment is on my mind of late as we prepare for a tense and controversial election cycle this November; as we enter into our diocesan planning process; as we work on strengthening Catholic education locally through Catholic Community Schools; as people are choosing colleges, looking for jobs, considering a move.

For 30 years or so, I have served on a variety of ethics committees in the health care world. The doctors and nurses, social workers and therapists, chaplains and administrators have taught me so much. Especially around medical decisions at the beginning and end of life, discernment is an essential skill. The process does not always yield a simple and clear single answer, but it guides decisions so that it is not simply the loudest voices, deepest pockets, or strongest emotions that carry the day.

In health care, we use a set of considerations that I summarize in the acronym PREHAB. This stands for Patient Preferences, Risks, Expense, Hope, Availability, and Benefit vs. Burden.

<u>Patient preferences</u> recognize that we are given stewardship over our own lives and are responsible for our choices in freedom.

<u>Risks</u> are those possible negative outcomes from our various options, or from doing nothing at all. They are weighed against one another and against the good outcome we are seeking.

<u>Expense</u> is the financial cost of our options; this is not to put a monetary value on life or health, but a recognition that our resources are limited and there are other goods we are also responsible to achieve with those resources.

<u>Hope</u> is the reasonable and grounded expectation of a good outcome from the option we would choose.

<u>Availability</u> is the objective possibility of selecting a given option. A person's frail health, the costs, the lack of technology needed in time or place, or a variety of reasons can make something effectively unavailable.

Benefit vs. burden is perhaps the most significant factor. We know that life usually includes a mix of these factors even in normal times. We make a moral calculus that weighs the goods we hope for against the sufferings we anticipate. When the benefits outweigh inevitable burdens, it is an ordinary means of care; when the burdens outweigh the benefits, the means becomes extraordinary and can be forgone.

That is all a very general and simplified version of what are often complicated dialogues and discernment. But as you prepare to vote; as we think about the future of our parishes and diocese; as you consider choices in your life and family, give some thought to a walk through the steps of PREHAB adapted to the questions before you. It will help slow down the mind, calm the emotions, and organize scattered thoughts in difficult choices.

Discernment may not give you a single, simple answer, but the result you arrive at will be considered, balanced, and well-reasoned. It can be difficult, but it is part of what we mean when we pray sincerely as Jesus teaches us: "Thy will be done."

# ST. STEPHEN BIBLE STUDY





The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (O.C.I.A.) formally called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.), is a process of faith formation that recognizes the uniqueness of each Individual's faith journey. For adults who have not been baptized or were baptized in another Christian tradition and desire to explore becoming Catholic. In addition, there is a process for families and children. The date/time of the sessions are adjusted based on needs of those involved. The process is concerned with the total formation of the person: learning about the Church community (doctrinal formation), living with the Church community (practical formation), praying with the Church (liturgical formation), and serving with the Church community (apostolic formation).
