## MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



Happy New Year!

With this first Sunday of Advent we begin a new liturgical year. The evangelist Mark will be our primary guide this liturgical year, with a sprinkling from the evangelist John in Advent, Easter, as well as, an extend block in August.

The liturgical year can seem like a paddle wheel, where here we are again stopping on the four weeks of Advent. Let me suggest a corkscrew movement to the liturgical year. With each passing liturgical season we are coming to a deeper understanding of our faith and what it means to be a disciple and follower of Jesus Christ.

Advent has two purposes. It first of all directs our mind and heart to await Christ's second coming, as it is a season to prepare for Christmas, when Christ's first coming is remembered. We are called to be joyful and strong in the faith as we live between the times.

Mark kicks off Advent with Jesus saying, "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come." (Mark 13:33) This proclamation seems worn and tired this year. Since March with emergence of the pandemic, we have been watchful and alert! The COVID refrain is well ingrained -- wear a mask, wash hands frequently, and maintain physical distance. Yet as I write, the COVID numbers are rising significantly and as you read this, we are in the second week of announced restrictions by Governor Walz.

It is unfortunate that discussions and action plans regarding COVID-19 became politicized. There will be some who will say God sent this pandemic because of our sinfulness, our corrupt society. Rather than focus on the "whys", let's focus on what can we continue to do as we walk this dark valley of the pandemic. There is the common sense action of wearing a mask, physical distancing, and hand washing. There comes a time when our individual freedoms need to give way to what is good for our neighbor.

Most importantly prayer needs to be at the center of our response. Let's give thanks that the death rate from COVID has lessened and that two vaccines are soon to be administered. Let's also lift in prayer all those who have COVID-19, especially in the hospital, asking for God's healing love. And we also lift in prayer all those attending to the sick and other essential workers.

Advent is a season of hope, reminding us that in the darkest of time Jesus comes to us. Jesus comes and walks with us, easing our burdens and anxieties, filling our hearts with hope. Christian hope is not wishful thinking but rather confidence in God's promises. Over and over in scripture we are remind that God loves us and actively seeks us out when we are lost. Some psalms to add to your Advent prayer --- Psalms 16, 24, 42, 80, 130, and 146. O come O come Emmanuel.

“Joyful Hope” seems fleeting these days as we continue to live with a virus that threatens our health, body, mind, and spirit. However, as Christians we know that true hope, the hope that all will be well, is a hope rooted in God’s plan for our salvation and his unconditional love for all people.

Can you imagine that our ancestors, the Hebrews of the Old Testament, lived thousands of years, generation upon generation, waiting for the Savior that they had come to expect through the words and vision and wisdom of the prophets? I wonder if we, modern day humanity, have the ability to wait so faithfully. And yet we do wait. 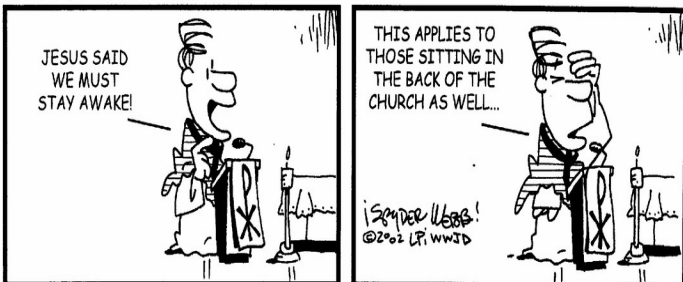
